Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program



The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) has announced a new cycle of the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program, which offers \$5 billion in appropriated funds. In fiscal year 2023 (FY23), up to \$1.17 billion is available. The SS4A program funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries.

CYCLE 2 CONSIDERATIONS - THINGS TO KNOW FOR PLANNING GRANTS

 Can fund new Safety Action Plans or Active Transportation Plans, Safe Routes to School Plans and Corridor Plans with a Safety Focus



- Can fund the update of Local Roadway Safety Plans completed in 2020 or earlier
- In Cycle 1, only \$213M in funding was submitted for planning grants, with unspent funds to roll over in FY 2023
- Out of the \$1.17B available in funding in FY 2023, 40% of funding is allocated for planning



- Minimum award is expected to be \$100,000 while the maximum is expected to be \$10 MILLION
- MOST JURISDICTIONS WHO APPLIED FOR SS4A PLANNING GRANTS IN FY 2022 RECEIVED FUNDING!

CYCLE 2 CONSIDERATIONS – THINGS TO KNOW FOR IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS

- Out of the \$1.17B available in FY 2023, 60% of this funding is allocated to implementation
- 100 implementation grants are expected to be awarded in FY 2023, while 37 were awarded in FY 2022
- Minimum award is expected to be \$2.5 MILLION while the maximum award is expected to be \$25 MILLION
- Implementation grants may include roadway safety planning activities directly associated with the project
- · USDOT may consider a partial award when selecting projects for implementation funding

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS FOR CYCLE 2 (FY 2023) SS4A FUNDING



- New tools have been made available from USDOT to determine whether a community is considered "underserved" and thus prioritized for SS4A funding
- Applications are to be submitted by 5pm EDT on July 10, 2023

Who is eligible to apply for SS4A grant funding?


- Metropolitan planning organizations (MPO)
- Counties, cities, towns, and transit agencies or other special districts that are subdivisions of a State
- Federally recognized Tribal governments
- Multijurisdictional groups comprised of the above entities
